

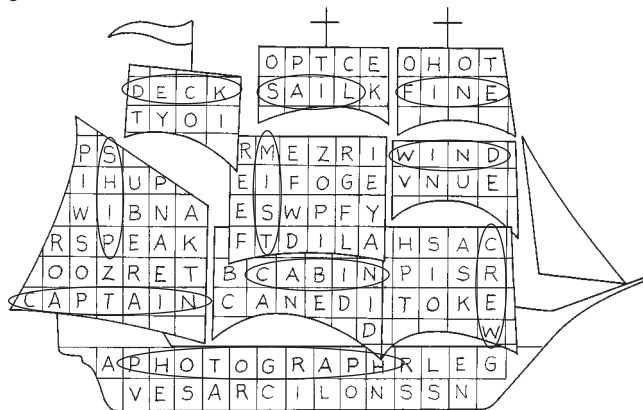
Alissa by C.J. Moore

- 5 Student's own answer. The next page of the log book could be about the captain seeing a ship coming. Perhaps it is bringing another captain (in 1869) who will take his/the place of the one writing in the log book. Now, in 1872, another captain has arrived. Or perhaps the next page is about still being alone – and similar to the log book entry on page 16.
